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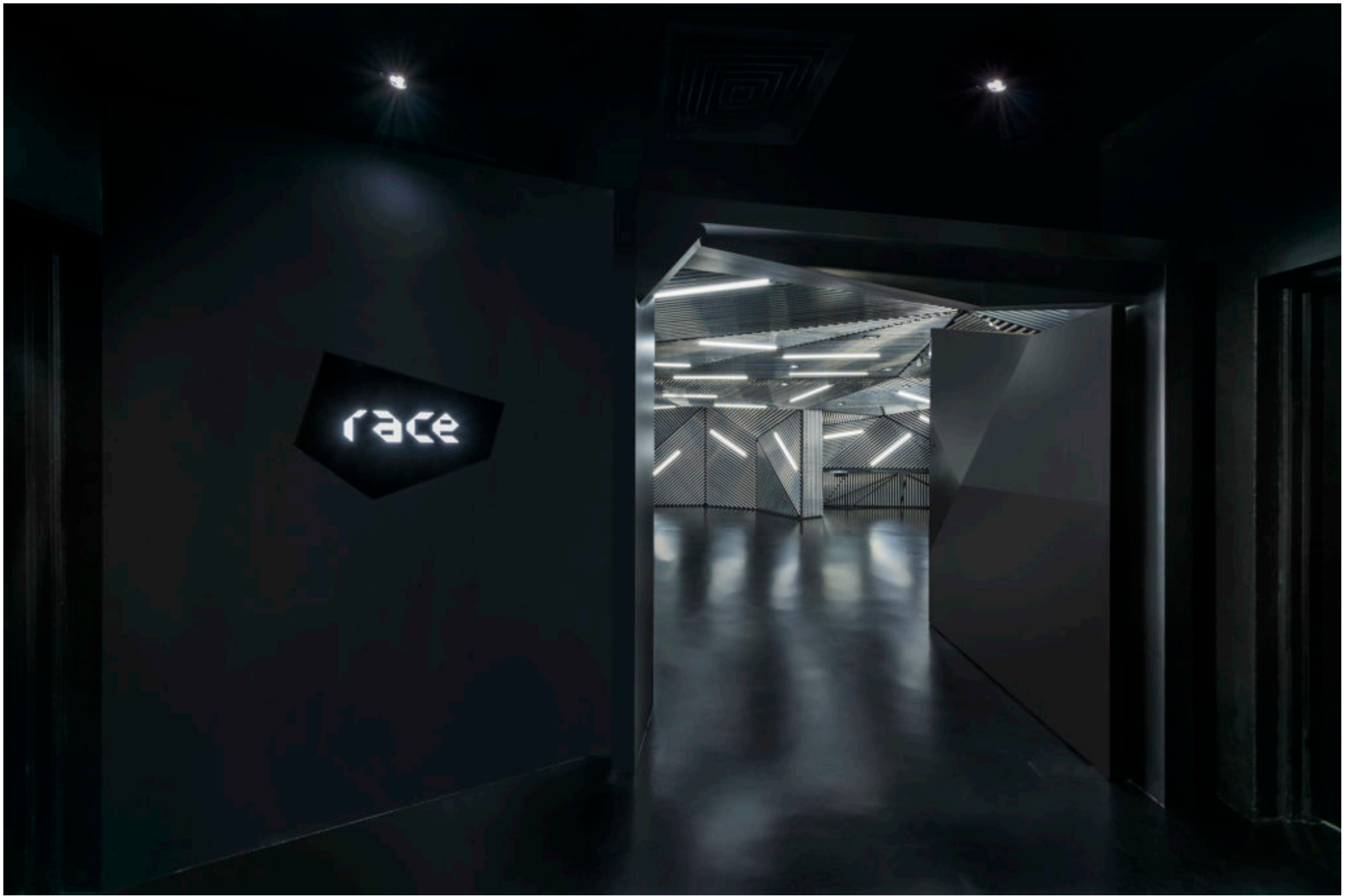
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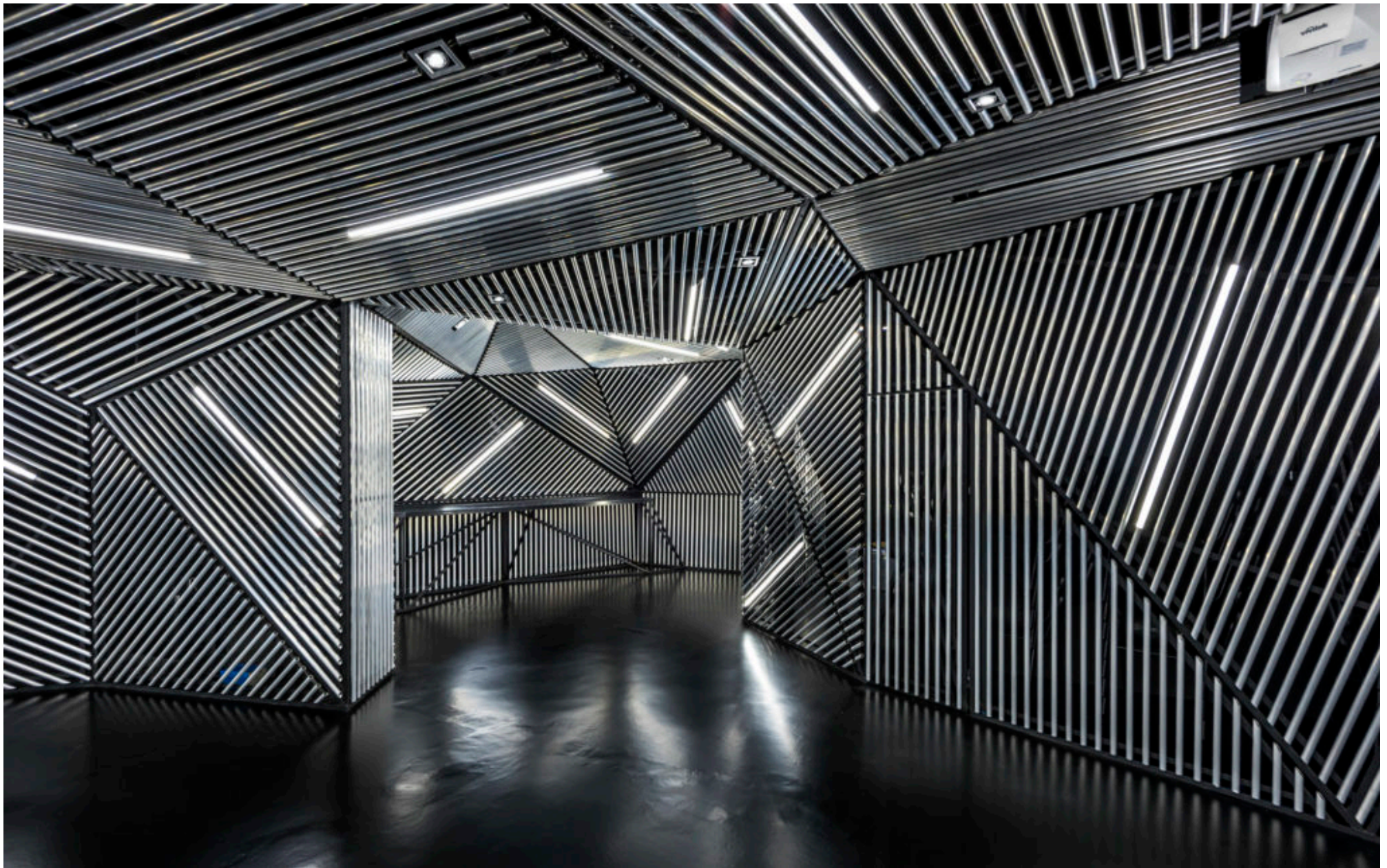

Well, at least that's what new robotic facility RACE thought when they commissioned the Ministry of Design (MOD) to design their new educational and engineering complex in Yishun.



Completed earlier this year, the new facility space looks more like a movie set for some high budget science fiction movie, rather than a place for robotics engineers to ply their trade. The space is designed in such a manner as to fit a wide variety of robots, as well as to have sufficient space for hands-on training and lectures.



Also, the astute usage of fluorescent lights, coupled with the stiff arrangement of aluminum pipes, creates an effect similar to that of walking into another dimension. Perhaps this was what David Bowie was thinking of when he came up with his Ziggy Stardust alter ego. Okay, that's a bit of a stretch, but you can't deny that RACE's lab design is out of this world.
