
Singapore hostel pairs millennial guests with like minded travellers



OO, a boutique hostel in Singapore aimed at digitally-minded millennials, has an app that enables guests to meet up with other travellers with similar interests.

Created by Ministry of Design, who also designed the space, the app allows guests to chat with other travellers. The COO Connect feature allows travellers to declare their interests and, if they are staying in the hostel at the same time as like-minded people, COO will facilitate an introduction.

Guests also have free Wi-Fi and access to a private space on the ground floor where they can set up a digital workstation.

There are 11 rooms over four floors with a total of 68 bunk beds. Each bunk has a private locker and a universal socket for charging electronics. Graphics on the walls of each room include numbers corresponding to the numbered bunks to show each guest where they should stack their luggage.

Graphics used throughout the location reflect local heritage, featuring interpretations of local cafes, traditional cakes and even the neighbourhood cat, Bob.

















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
